



# Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies Award

The Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies (SIIT) is a First Nation-governed educational institution. SIIT provides adult learners with academic, vocational, and technical training as well as services and supports for employment and career growth. Indigenous learners are at the core of SIIT, representing over 95% of the student body.

Established in 1976, SIIT offers a variety of certificate and diploma programs in the areas of business and technology, health and community studies, trades and industrial, and adult basic education. Programming is delivered through three principal campus locations in Regina, Saskatoon, and Prince Albert, nine Career Centres, and over 30 community-based learning sites located across the province.

#### The Award

The Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies offers a **\$1,000 award** for any Graduate who has participated in The Princess Shop's Dress Program and will be attending any of SIIT's post-secondary or trades and industrial programs. Only students accepted, enrolled, and registered with SIIT are eligible to receive the award. The award money will be disbursed by the end of November each academic year via EFT or applied to outstanding tuition or fees owing to SIIT.

## **The Application**

Any Graduate who has participated in The Princess Shop's Dress Program and has applied to and is accepted to a post-secondary or trades and industrial program or course offered through SIIT may apply for this award.

Applications must include:

• A completed application form, that can be found on our website or emailed to you.

To receive this award, the applicant must provide confirmation of enrolment within the first month of starting your program/course. Courses must start within three (3) months of being selected as the scholarship recipient.
